Traffic Report





While the support staff began with collection, storage and packing of the items the Interact students, the faculty and the management sisters also joined them later on to make food kits for timely distribution. Each Daan Utsav kit consists of 5 kg rice, & 1 kg each of Dal, Atta, Sugar & Oil.

An astounding total of 3000 kgs of food was distributed to the needy in various shelters for the orphans, the elderly, the destitute, the mentally and physically challenged. The distribution dates and places were as follows:

Save Water


Have you ever wondered how one would be living in a world without water? It is very difficult to imagine life without water. Before it is too late, let us follow some good methods to conserve water.


Back at the hotel we danced with abandon at the DJ party exclusively arranged for us. Being the first overnight school trip for us made it more thrilling for us.




Kerala: God's Own Country An Excursion of Class XI to Thekkady and Kochi



Being a vegetarian, I did struggle regarding food, but I could manage to find some on which I could survive.


The view of Jungfrau and Matterhorn left me awe-struck. I got a chance to play in the snow, although it was unbearably cold.

आर्टिफिशियल इंटेलिजेंस

प्रस्तावना

आर्टिफिशियल इंटेलिजेंस कंप्यूटर का वह सिस्टम है, जो उन कार्यों को इंसानी बुद्धि की सहायता से कर सकता है, जिन्हें करने के लिए इंसान की आवश्यकता होती है। वह सभी काम करता है। आज के इस आधुनिक युग में एआई का इस्तेमाल करना बेहद सामान्य बात है। हम जिन भी उपकरणों का इस्तेमाल अपनी सुविधा के लिए कर रहे हैं, अब यह सब एआई के माध्यम से इस्तेमाल किए जा सकते हैं। आने वाले समय में एआई हमारे समय की काफी बचत करेगा। आर्टिफिशियल इंटेलिजेंस को इस तरह से बनाया गया है, कि यह कार्य करने से पहले स्वयं निर्णय लेने सक्षम होगा कि कार्य को करना सही रहेगा या नहीं। इसका मुख्य इस्तेमाल मशीन लर्निंग के लिए किया जाएगा।

आर्टिफिशियल इंटेलिजेंस की शुरुआत कब हुई?

आर्टिफिशियल इंटेलिजेंस याने की एआई की शुरुआत 1950 से हो गई थी, लेकिन इसकी असली अहमियत 1970 के दशक में लोगों को पता चली। एआई को बनाने की पहल सबसे पहले जापान ने की थी। 1981 में जापान में फिफ्थ जनरेशन नामक योजना की शुरुआत की गई। जापान के द्वारा शुरुआत करने के बाद अन्य देशों ने भी आर्टिफिशियल इंटेलिजेंस की महत्वता को समझते हुए उस पर काम करना शुरू किया। इसके बाद 1983 में कुछ निजी संस्थाओं ने मिलकर आर्टिफिशियल इंटेलिजेंस को लागू करने के लिए वेरी लार्ज स्केल इंटीग्रेटेड सर्किट का विकास करने के लिए माइक्रो इलेक्ट्रॉनिक्स एंड कंप्यूटर टेक्नोलॉजी की स्थापना की।

आर्टिफिशियल इंटेलिजेंस के उदाहरण

आज हम जितनी भी एडवांस टेक्नोलॉजी का इस्तेमाल कर रहे हैं, वह सब आर्टिफिशियल इंटेलिजेंस पर आधारित है। आर्टिफिशियल इंटेलिजेंस का इस्तेमाल हम अपने स्मार्टफोन में कई सारी एप्लीकेशंस के रूप में भी कर रहे हैं। इसके अलावा एआई का इस्तेमाल स्मार्ट कार, स्मार्ट होम, स्मार्ट फर्नीचर बनाने के लिए भी कर रहे हैं। किसी भी चीज को खोजने के लिए गूगल सर्च पर वॉइस सर्च के माध्यम एआई से किया जा रहा है। आर्टिफिशियल इंटेलिजेंस के उदाहरण इस प्रकार है:

निष्कर्ष

आर्टिफिशियल इंटेलिजेंस पिछले कुछ सालों से चर्चा का विषय बना हुआ है। समय-समय पर वैज्ञानिक इसके अच्छे और बुरे परिणामों को लेकर विचार-विमर्श करते रहते हैं। आज दुनियां को बदलने में टेक्नोलॉजी एक अहम भूमिका निभा रही है। आर्टिफिशियल इंटेलिजेंस के आने के बाद वैज्ञानिक द्वारा इसके कई सारे फायदे बताए गए हैं, साथ में वैज्ञानिकों ने यह भी माना है, कि इसके आने के बाद नुकसान इंसानों का ही होगा। आर्टिफिशियल इंटेलिजेंस का निर्माण मशीनों को नियंत्रण करने के लिए किया गया है, लेकिन अगर मशीन स्वयं ही निर्णय लेने लगेगी तो उसे काबू कर पाना बेहद ही मुश्किल होगा।

हमारे नेताजी

23 जनवरी को उस महान व्यक्ति की जयंती है जिसके आह्वान पर हजारों लोग आजादी की लड़ाई में कूद पड़े. जिसके जादुई और अद्भुत नेतृत्व कौशल ने भारतीय स्वतंत्र संग्राम में नई जान फूंकी. इस दिन स्वतंत्रता सेनानी नेताजी सुभाष चन्द्र बोस की जयंती है. नेताजी की जीवनी, उनके क्रांतिकारी विचार और उनका कठोर त्याग व बलिदान के कारण ही आज भारत स्वतंत्र होकर इतनी ऊंचाइयों तक पहुंच रहा है|वर्ष 1919 में उन्होंने भारतीय सिविल सेवा (ICS) की परीक्षा पास की थी। हालांकि बाद में बोस ने सिविल सेवा से त्यागपत्र दे दिया।

आज़ाद हिंद फ़ौज या इंडियन नेशनल आर्मी ने भारत की आज़ादी में एक महत्वपूर्ण भूमिका निभाई थी। इस फ़ौज की स्थापना 1942 में भारत के एक क्रांतिकारी नेता 'रासबिहारी बोस' द्वारा टोक्यो (जापान) में की गयी थी और 21 अक्टूबर 1943 को इस फौज का नेतृत्व 'सुभाष चंद्र बोस' को सौंप दिया गया। जब नेताजी ने इस फौज की कमान संभाली, तब इसमें लगभग 45,000 सैनिक थे और सन 1944 तक आते-आते इस फ़ौज में सैनिकों की संख्या 85,000 हो गई थी।

इसी फ़ौज में एक महिला यूनिट भी शामिल थी, जिसकी कप्तान 'लक्ष्मी सहगल' थी। इस फ़ौज को जापान का काफी सहयोग मिला था। क्योंकि इस फौज में ज्यादातर वही सैनिक शामिल थे, जिन्हें जापान ने बंदी बना लिया था, बाद में दूसरे देशों के सैनिक भी इससे जुड़ गए थे।

आजाद हिंद फौज का प्रमुख उद्देश्य भारत की आज़ादी के लिए अंग्रेजों से लड़ना था। प्रासंगिक रूप से, आज़ादी की लड़ाई को आवश्यक गति प्रदान करने में इसने महत्वपूर्ण भूमिका निभाई थी। 30 दिसंबर 1943 में नेताजी सुभाष चंद्र बोस ने पोर्ट ब्लेयर में तिरंगा फहरा कर अंडमान और निकोबार द्वीप समूह को ब्रिटिश राज से मुक्त होने वाला पहला भारतीय क्षेत्र घोषित किया था।

21 अक्तूबर, 1943 को सुभाष चंद्र बोस ने सिंगापुर में आजाद हिंद (जिसे अरजी हुकुमत-ए-आज़ाद हिंद के रूप में भी जाना जाता है) की अनंतिम सरकार के गठन की घोषणा की, जिसमें वह स्वयं राज्य के प्रमुख, प्रधानमंत्री और युद्ध मंत्री थे। जिस सरकार का सुभाष चंद्र बोस नेतृत्व कर रहे थे us सरकार को 12 देशों ने मान्यता दी। एक चटर्जी द्वारा वित्त मंत्रालय संभाल जा रहा था तथा लक्ष्मी स्वामीनाथन द्वारा महिला आयोग आदि।

अनंतिम सरकार ने न केवल बोस को जापानियों के साथ समान स्तर पर बातचीत करने में सक्षम बनाया, बल्कि इंडियन नेशनल आर्मी (INA) में शामिल होने और इसके समर्थन के लिये पूर्वी एशिया में भारतीयों को लामबंद करने में भी मदद की।

एक टपके के द्वारा यह माना जाता है कि उ सुभाष चंद्र बोस की आजाद हिंद फौज की वजह से ही भारत को ब्रिटिश राज से छोड़ा आजादी मिली| उनकी जयंती 23 जनवरी को 'पराक्रम दिवस' के रूप में मनाई जाती है। ऐसे वीर पराक्रमियों को शत-शत नमन|
